The image of Jesus is found in our hearts and in our minds and serves as a beautiful and powerful reminder of God's greatest gift, the life of His Son Jesus. We are reminded by the image of the crucified Christ, which is the focal point of the liturgy of Good Friday, that Jesus Christ makes us realize the true seriousness of human sin.

It is called 'Good' Friday

because of the goodness Jesus showed in giving life as a sacrifice for others. On Good Friday, we gaze on the Cross at Calvary. Each member of the Church tries to understand at what cost Christ has won our redemption.

In the solemn ceremonies of Good Friday, in the Adoration of the Cross, in the chanting of the 'Reproaches', in the reading of the Passion, and in receiving the pre-consecrated Host, we unite ourselves to our Savior, and we contemplate our own death to sin in the Death of our Lord.

Called "good" because of all the wonder and meaning that flowed from it, this is the day when Jesus was handed over to trial, tortured, forced to carry his cross (a Roman tool for executing criminals) through the streets of Jerusalem, nailed to the cross on the hill known as



Golgotha, or Calvary, and allowed to die a slow and agonizing death there, while crowds mocked him and his disciples hid in fear.

In the days of His flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to Him who was able to save Him from death, and He was heard for His godly fear.

Although He was a Son, He learned obedience through what He suffered; and being made perfect He became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey Him. Let us rejoice as we remember that special day on which the Truth set us free.

***Blessed are those who have not seen, and yet have come to believe.*** John 20:29 Come join our brotherhood in prayer, be a part of the most solemn of ceremonies. **Good Friday.**

**There is an Old Russian story:** A farmer finds a magic lantern on the side of the road. He rubs it, and a genie appears who promises to grant him one wish. The farmer thinks for a moment then says: "My neighbor has a cow. I don't have a cow. Kill my neighbor's cow." This story humorously points to one of the greatest temptations in the spiritual life as well as one of the greatest dangers to true fraternity in a group: envy. Envy is one of the seven deadly sins and is defined as "sadness at the good fortune of another." St. Augustine said that he thought that envy was just as bad as pride and was therefore one of the most dangerous sins. He believed that it was envy as well as pride that led Adam to eat the apple in his attempt to be like God.

Within groups or organizations, envy is very destructive. It can lead to resentment, grudges, back-biting, gossip and all of the things which destroy the good spirit of charity and camaraderie that should exist within groups. We fight envy by developing a sense of gratitude for our own gifts and a sense of humility over our gifts and failings. Lastly, the best way to fight envy is by acts of charity, particularly towards those whom we envy.

As Knights, we must constantly strive to love our Brothers and seek to build them up at all times. We rejoice in their gifts and we share our own. This ensures that one of the pillars of our organization, namely Fraternity, will always be strong.

**Church** – My Brother Knights; Alleluia! The Lord is risen! Alleluia! This gives us hope to one day rise with Him and encounter Him in an intimate way. Did you know that we already have a foretaste and participation in this? The Church teaches “... **our participation in the Eucharist already gives us a foretaste of Christ's transfiguration of our bodies: Just as bread that comes from the earth, after God's blessing has been invoked upon it, is no longer ordinary bread, but Eucharist, formed of two things, the one earthly and the other heavenly: so too our bodies, which partake of the Eucharist, are no longer corruptible, but possess the hope of resurrection.**”

In the last newsletter, we looked at the significance of Lent and of identifying those things which keep us from a better relationship with God and our acceptance that we rely totally upon Him. We looked at the importance of, not only the reward, but also of the struggle itself and the ability to “persevere”, again, relying on God's grace to fortify us. As Catholics, we are especially fortified by the miracle of the Eucharist. Again, the Church teaches “**Daily conversion and penance find their source and nourishment in the Eucharist, for in it is made present the sacrifice of Christ which has reconciled us with God. Through the Eucharist those who live from the life of Christ are fed and strengthened. "It is a remedy to free us from our daily faults and to preserve us from mortal sins."**
