**Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism:** As one fraternal year draws to a close, and another is set to begin, I thought about where we've been and where we are headed as a council. As often as possible one should take a personal inventory or examine one's conscience, recognize shortcomings, resolve to make the changes necessary for improvement, and most importantly **respond to the resolution to improve.** To varying degrees, methods, and principles used to review and to map out future direction, businesses, groups, organizations, ministries, etc. should also examine themselves, make honest assessments, make adjustments, and follow through. With this in mind, we should examine ourselves collectively and individually as a council and members of it. How do we measure success as a council? Is it the amount of hours volunteered, the number of programs we offer, the quality of our social activities, the number of new members added to our roster, how many Brothers show up for meetings, how many get involved, or how much money we have raised? While these areas (and much more) actually are used to measure our success on paper, I submit that a more simple and pure test (one of the heart) is "how do we measure up to the four principles of our Order?" Now, It is not my intention to give answers or even subliminally lead up to the answers (that is the work of the Holy Spirit), rather, to simply ask the questions in a particular light. So, how do we measure up to these principles? **Charity:** Why is this the first principle? Does it just "sound" or "look" better in this position? As Christians, we are all called to holiness; "as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in every aspect of your conduct".<sup>1</sup> Charity is called *the soul of the holiness to which all are called.*<sup>2</sup> When we have engaged in charitable activities, have we recognized this call to holiness? Have we been conscious of the examples we set for others, so they might recognize "the soul of holiness" in our charity? *Grace (the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call)*<sup>3</sup>, by uniting us to Christ in active love (charity), ensures the supernatural quality of our acts and consequently their merit before God and before men.<sup>4</sup> Have we understood that we do not initiate our acts of charity, that God does? Have we understood and recognized that "good" works are truly efficacious only when they are rooted in and reflect the light and love of Christ? **Unity:** Have we done more than try to "give an

appearance of a unified front"? Have we understood and recognized that this principle calls us to be a sign of something more to others? Have we understood and recognized that true unity amongst ourselves is rooted in and flows from our union with Christ? If so, have we understood and responded to the fact that nowhere is that union more perfect than at Mass? *Indeed, they form one body, whether by hearing the word of God, or by joining in the prayers and the singing, or above all by the common offering of Sacrifice and by a common partaking at the Lord's table.*<sup>5</sup> **Fraternity:** Like our principle of unity, have we understood and recognized that our "brotherhood" is rooted in Christ? Have we understood that we are not just another men's group or organization? When we call each other "brother", do we realize that our brotherhood should be an example and testament to the brotherhood of all Christians? Do we understand that we are brothers because Christ first made us His own brothers, and what He had to do to accomplish that? Finally, do we understand that by virtue of our fraternity, we have a responsibility to one another in our Christian walk, even charitably (lovingly) correcting in matters of Faith and morals when necessary? ... *charity demands beneficence and fraternal correction.*<sup>6</sup> **Patriotism:** The emblem of the 4th Degree depicts the globe, cross and dove (Father Son, and Holy Spirit). Have we understood and recognized our patriotism (love and devotion to country) is rooted in all that is good and oriented toward our God in our beloved nation? Have we been careful not to succumb to "blind patriotism", ignoring matters in our country that are not oriented toward God and therefore need correcting? Do we understand that true freedom attains perfection only when it is directed toward God?<sup>7</sup> If so, have we understood that we are people of God first (brothers, if you will with all humanity), and have we stood up for what is right in the eyes of God and not popular secularist thought, defending the rights of those less fortunate and those unable to defend themselves? *"The order of things must be subordinate to the order of persons, and not the other way around."*<sup>8</sup>

Get the picture it was a team effort and the results will show it. Financial report will be given at the June 26th officer meeting and the July 11th General Council meeting.

**Calendar planning session:** In the month of July we will be planning our next 15 months calendar. Time and place will be announced via e-mail at a later time. Please send all events that should be added to our calendar to Ken LaPlante or Don Dyson by July 1st. This will ensure an efficient planning session and minimal changes.

**Budget Planning sessions:** The budget planning sessions will be held in a series of three meetings in the July and August timeframe.

The first phase will concentrate on Event planning expenses and revenue. Each event planner should come with a tentative budget for FY 2008/2009 and historical actuals if the event has been held in the past.

The second meeting will focus on funds disbursement and operational expenses. After operational expenses have been plugged based on last year and projected changes we will then look at disbursement options for available funds. EACH COMMITTEE CHAIR SHOULD COME PREPARED TO ASK FOR LESS, OR FIND LEGITIMATE REVENUE SOLUTIONS. We are entering into a very uncertain economic environment and will need to plan very cautiously to ensure we are adequately protecting the council's assets.

The third phase will be slightly different, yet very important. We will be assigning an owner to every line item on the budget. This will ensure that each line item has the required ownership of both event execution and funds disbursement. As an example, I will own the Texas hold'em expense line as well as the Texas Hold'em revenue line. As an owner of a revenue and expense line, I will be responsible for Motions to fund the line, periodic status reports to the General Council and Officer

meetings, expense control and accurate actual reporting at the end of each event.

**Grand Knights message related to budgets:** To be very clear, the success of future events is a burden that must be borne by the entire council. Event coordinators will clearly define needs, but it is the duty of the entire Council to step up and fill those needs. We have done fantastic jobs in this area, however it is time to get the entire council active. There are many Brothers who have signed up that need to come forward and assist or even take over some of these events. With all the new Brothers to our council, I am surprised that new recommendations have not come forward.

If you have an interest and don't know how to get involved, send me an e-mail or give me a call. I will personally get you in touch with the correct person to match your interests with the activities of this council. We know you became Knights for a reason. I would like to lend assistance and to ensure that you have all the opportunities necessary to fulfill those reasons.

Come forward, you'll be glad that you did.
