I am a local business owner and as such recognize the value of knowing where you stand monetarily so that you can make the proper decisions based on what money you have coming in and going out. I have organized our Council's accounts in a financial bookkeeping program for accuracy and convenience of reporting. I highly regard this responsibility and will perform my duties to the best of my ability.

Gentlemen, please consider this a plea for your assistance. We have several Brothers who are in "Dues Arrears". If you are one of these gentlemen, please contact me to resolve the situation. If there is a doubt in your mind regarding your "Dues Status", please contact me. If you are in "Dues Arrears" or not, and are considering resigning from the Knights of Columbus, again, please contact me. If there is anything at all I/we can do to convince you to remain with the Knights, I/we will do my/our best to accommodate you. If you insist on resigning from the Knights, please do so in writing to me by e-mail and/or mailed correspondence.

Our Council works on a very tight budget. When a Brother fails to pay his dues, it puts a heavy strain on the budget. Not only do we not receive funds budgeted, but it costs us approximately 50% of those dues in fees to the State Council and the Supreme Council. For example, we have over eighty (80) brothers in "Dues Arrears" (that's over \$3,200.00 in anticipated **and budgeted** funds we did not receive). Even though we did not receive the dues from those Brothers, our Council had to pay over \$1,600.00 in the aforementioned fees. **Therefore, our budget is technically over \$4,800.00 in "The Red" before the year begins.**

Again, if you are in "Dues Arrears", please pay your dues or contact me with the reason you are unable to do so. If you know anyone who may be in dues arrears, please have him pay his dues or contact me.

For the first time, the Annual Mexican Dinner is being augmented to include a cultural celebration of and for all parishioners. Over 25 Cultural Tents will be on display between Noon and 3:00 PM. The cultural tents will display how our Catholic faith is celebrated in each country along with providing other fun facts from the represented countries.

At the center of our faith celebration, will be a very special Children's Sidewalk Chalk Rosary at 3:30 PM and Multi-Lingual Mass at 5:00 PM which will be celebrated in English, Spanish, Tagalog and Hindi. Neither event is to be missed!!!

In fact, we have received verbal indications from some spouses and other family members that they really enjoy and make use of the hardcopies they have been receiving. Our current preferences don't reflect this fact.

Often we don't go out of our way to print out a hardcopy of a document when a softcopy is available, nor do we communicate to our families when we are notified that the new issue is available on-line. This is completely understandable given the volume of e-mails we all receive and everything we're involved with. It's very likely to get lost in the sauce or slip our minds, no matter how well intended we are.

Once you have confirmed your preference with your family, if you decide you'd like to change your preference, please do the following:

 - PDF (Email) – This will be the default setting, in which you will get the newsletter in softcopy (PDF file) only format
 - Both – Select this if you want both a softcopy AND a hardcopy mailing
 - Mail (Printed) – Select this if you want a hardcopy mailing only
 - None – Select this if you want neither
- While you're in the form, take the opportunity to update any other information that requires updating
- Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on the "Submit Information" button.

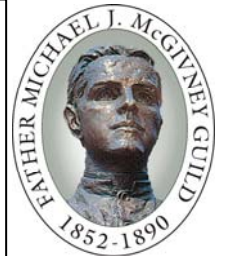
